MINOR IN ASIAN STUDIES

As a companion to a major in an academic or professional field, the interdisciplinary Minor in Asian Studies broadens and enriches the student's academic experience. It inculcates skills and concepts for appreciating the rich civilizations of Asia and for dealing professionally with Asian peoples. The Minor is a valuable credential for graduate study and an international career. Students who have completed any one of the courses required for the Minor with a grade of C or better may apply for the Minor.

Required courses: 24-30 credit hours

1. Language Proficiency: 4 courses

Intermediate proficiency in an Asian language. Students who satisfy the language requirement through a means other than course work must take two advanced courses in addition to the three required below; only one of the two may be in the student's major department.

2. Core course: 1 course

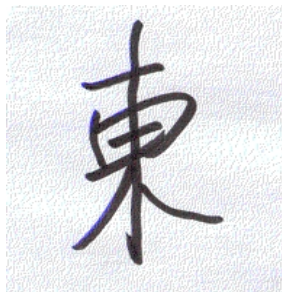
HIS 182: Asian Civilization II, or PSC 229: East Asian Political Economy, or AS 220: Culture and the Arts of East Asia

3. Advanced Courses: 3 courses

Three approved Asian courses at the 300 or 400-level. Two must be outside the student's major department. One 300-400-level language course; two semesters of Business Japanese, Business Chinese, or Business Korean; and one course in Asian-American studies are options which may be counted toward the Advanced Course requirement.

A minimum grade of C must be achieved in each course in the Minor. For more information, contact Prof. Thomas W. Burkman, Director of Asian Studies.

Except for the language proficiency requirement, courses applied to another minor or a major may not be applied to this minor.
